2nd Women in Macro Workshop

April 24, 2026

We are pleased to announce the **2nd Women in Macro Workshop** on **April 24, 2026**, co-organized by the International Macro-TCD (IM-TCD) group at Trinity College Dublin, Central Bank of Ireland, and the Irish Society for Women in Economics (ISWE).

This workshop aims to promote research excellence by providing women macroeconomists with an opportunity to present their research and receive constructive feedback. We especially encourage submissions from **junior researchers** who are in the final stages of their PhD, in postdoctoral positions, assistant professors, or in equivalent policy roles.

Limited funding is available for PhD students thanks to support from the Society for Nonlinear Dynamics and Econometrics (SNDE) and International Association for Applied Econometrics (IAAE).

Hélène Rey (London Business School) will deliver the keynote address.

Format:

The one-day workshop will take place in person with each presentation during main sessions followed by a discussion and a short talks session for early stage projects.

Venue:

The workshop will take place at the Central Bank of Ireland, in Dublin, Ireland. There are no conference fees, and refreshments will be provided.
