
In the past year, there have been several positive developments, as you will see on the pages of this report.

Trinity Global is at the heart of Trinity's work as a University of Sanctuary and, just in time for the start of the academic year, we were delighted to welcome four postgraduate students from Gaza, supported by Sanctuary scholarships. Then, on Friday, 18 April, it was with enormous pleasure and relief that we welcomed a further ten students and two research staff. This took a collective effort across College along with the great generosity of many donors. We were also supported by the Department of Justice, the Department of Foreign Affair and Trade, the Irish Red Cross, the Health Services Executive and our local partner, the Gaza Scholarships Initiative.

This is such an exciting time in Trinity College Dublin with our new Strategic Plan 2025-2030 due to be launched in the coming months. Closely aligned with this is the development of Trinity's new Institutional Framework for Internationalisation and Global Engagement. The publication of this new Framework will take place later this year.

I conclude with the motto of Trinity College Dublin: *perpetuis* futuris temporibus duraturam. It sets the scene for a university that will last into endless future times. As we prepare now for the next chapter, we are firm in our ambition to rise above the challenges of these times, balancing our commitment to climate and nature with the spirit of adventure that leads us towards greater and more impactful global engagement.

We supported 2,000 students through the Goin' to Trinity app which allows students to build communities based on shared interests and make connections prior to beginning classes. In addition, we hosted 12 online Pathway to Belonging pre-departure sessions attended by 800+ students.


Sanctuary Scholarships

We marked Refugee Day in June 2024 with a hybrid event 'Connected Learning in Crisis' at the Trinity Global Room.


We supported the MASI (Movement of Asylum Seekers in Ireland) 10-year anniversary conference.

Trinity Students

A total of **22,686** students at Trinity in 2024/25, **17,543** EU and **5,143** Non-EU.

Trinity Global reached **101.4%** of the student recruitment ambitions outlined in the Global Engagement Strategy for 2024/25. **69%** were undergraduate students and **31%** were postgraduate students.

Student Recruitment and Marketing

1200+ student recruitment events attended global, majority in-person.

Range of countries visited to promote Trinity included Brazil, Cambodia, Canada, China, Colombia, Egypt, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Jordan, Mexico, Philippines, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, South Africa, Spain, Switzerland, Thailand, Turkey, UK, USA and Vietnam.

Goin' to Trinity app supported over **2,000** incoming students. The app allows students to build communities based on shared interests and make connections prior to beginning classes.

We have supported 20 of the 24 Trinity Schools and 41 courses, providing marketing support in the form of advertising campaigns, course videos, webinars, photography, and CRM emails to future students. We have **230,000+** social media followers across our global social media channels.



Global Mobility

1,344 (41%) of third year undergraduate Trinity students undertook an international experience as part of their programme in 2024/25.

Over 400 students were supported to study abroad through the Global Mobility Bursary scheme and 562 students were supported by an Erasmus+ grant.

We also have a team of 4 global mobility ambassadors.

We launched the Trinity Global Mobility Hub, an in-person advising space located in the Arts Block. The Mobility Hub provides students interested in Erasmus+ or international exchange programmes with a confidential meeting space to speak with a member of the Global Mobility Team staff or with a Trinity student ambassador.

Visits to and from Embassies, as well as the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade, European Institutions including Ambassadors, government delegations, dignitaries and donors to the University.

The Vice President for Global Engagement hosted visits by Ambassadors from Austria, Cyprus, Greece, Pakistan and Switzerland, and attended visits from the French and German Ambassadors hosted by the Provost.

Dr. Emma Stokes, Vice President for Global Engagement, hosted a special evening celebrating the Hubert Butler Essay Prize and the winning entrant, Trinity Teaching Fellow, Dr. Conor Daly from the School of Languages, Literatures and Cultural Studies.

Trinity hosted an interactive student event, 'An Insight into Ireland's Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT)'. Michael Gaffey, Director General of the Development Cooperation and Africa Division (Irish Aid) was in conversation with Professor Gail McElroy, followed by lively Q&A and networking with DFAT and our students.

A delegation from the Czech Embassy and Czech Academy of Sciences (CAS) met with Trinity Global and senior members of the Faculty of AHSS to discuss potential collaboration.




Partnerships

The School of Medicine received approval for an International Clinical Fellowship Programme pilot with the Bahrain Government Hospitals and plans to welcome initial clinical fellows later this year.

Supported Schools and Departments to develop 30 new partnerships which include student exchange and staff mobility including a new university-wide student exchange agreement with the University of Canberra.

Audit completed of Trinity Global portfolio of 600 partnership agreements.
