Post Summary

St. James Hospital and the School of Nursing and Midwifery is offering one part-time funded scholarships for entry into the PhD programme March or September 2027.

The scholarships are open to nurses and midwives who are not currently registered for a PhD, but who have a strong desire to discover new practices and knowledge through evidence-based approaches. The Joint PhD Scholarship offers a pathway to nurses to conduct research that advances innovation in practice within St James Hospital and associated partners, for example to improve the integration of care, services or health systems. The Scholarships offer

opportunities for suitably qualified nurses to pursue a Structured PhD which must align with one of with the nursing strategy pillars in St. James Hospital and of the Trinity Centre for Practice and Healthcare Innovation (TCPHI) research centre in the School of Nursing and Midwifery, Trinity College Dublin offers leading expertise: <https://nursing-midwifery.tcd.ie/research/research-themes/index.php>

Areas of subject focus

- Integrated Care
- Workforce and People
- Digital & Data
- Chronic Illness
- Cancer care & survivorship
- Evidence-based nursing practice, Research & Innovation

These are suggested areas, but the list is not exhaustive. Other fields of study that seek to enhance health outcomes for service users of St James Hospital will be considered.

Applications will be scored according to the following criteria:

- Quality of research proposal including how the proposed research will advance and contribute to existing knowledge.
- Alignment of the research with St James nursing research priorities and TCD Nursing & Midwifery School's research strategy
- The applicant's academic track record and research potential including a well-defined career development plan,
- How the proposed research will benefit the applicant, society, and the profession of nursing.
- Must be a registered nurse and employed in St James's Hospital for at least 2 years

Prospective students are advised that they **must** secure the agreement and support of an academic in the school who will become the primary supervisor for the PhD for the application to be eligible for review. The research proposal will be developed, in consultation with the primary supervisor. In addition, formal application to TCD must be advanced to the TCD PhD programme (link provided below).

Standard Duties and Responsibilities of the Post

If awarded the scholarship, students must register with the School of Nursing and Midwifery in Trinity College Dublin and have a member of the academic staff in the School of Nursing and Midwifery as the primary supervisor for the PhD. As a registered student in the School of Nursing and Midwifery, you will become a member of the school's research community and are warmly encouraged to participate in the many and varied research activities and events during the academic year. It is required that successful applicants will contribute to shared learning with nursing colleagues in St James's Hospital. This includes update meetings with the Director of Nursing and ADoN for Evidence-Based Nursing Research & Innovation, as well as participating in research councils/committees, presenting at Nursing Grand Rounds, Nurse Executive meetings and other leadership /education forums relevant to the PhD topic.

All students must comply with the Regulations for Higher Degrees by Research are contained in the University Calendar Part III. The University Calendar is available in all College libraries, the Departmental offices and online (<http://www.tcd.ie/calendar/>).

Part time: EU academic fees

Person Specification

- The applicant must be a registered general nurse with a minimum of 2 years work experience in St James's Hospital.
- **The scholarship is open to nurses who are not currently registered for a PhD.**

Qualifications

A minimum of 2.1 Honours degree (level 8) and/or a postgraduate qualification (level 9).

Residency

- Applicants must have been resident in an EU member state for 3 out of the last 5 years to be eligible for EU fees.
- Employment status with St James Hospital
- Eligibility for the scholarship will be for staff who have been employed on a permanent full-time basis in St James for 2 or more years

- Scholarship arrangements for individual students will be contingent upon the person remaining employed in St. James Hospital.
- Should the student leave employment before completion of the PhD, they will be required to relinquish the scholarship and to self-fund for the remainder of their PhD studies.

Knowledge & Experience (Essential & Desirable)

An understanding of the research process in healthcare would be beneficial to the post.

Skills & Competencies

- A self-motivated, enthusiastic and dynamic approach to work
- Excellent organisation, communication skills and IT skills
- Strong writing and analytical skills

The following documentation must be attached to the application:

- Cover letter and CV
- Personal statement including career plan (500 words)
- Two letters of reference (academic) and one from clinical area (e.g. Assistant Director of Nursing)
- *Research proposal of approx. 3,000 words, to include specifically the following elements:
 - Abstract (300 words, approx.)
 - Background context and rationale for the research
 - Aims, objectives and central research questions
 - Methodology including details of any specialist knowledge/data required
 - Relevant ethical issues

- Milestones and deliverables (Gantt chart)
- Where the research fits within the School and College research strategies
- Dissemination plans and potential impact

The applicant will work with a potential supervisor from TCPHI to develop a robust Research Proposal to be submitted as part of the application process. Trinity College Dublin will charge an application fee. You may receive notification following your application to college that your application to be a PhD student has been accepted. This is a separate process from your application for the Scholarship. You will be notified of the outcome of your Scholarship application separately.

The Selection Process in Trinity

The Selection Committee (Interview Panel) may include members of the Academic and Administrative community together with External Assessor(s) who are expert in the area and St James's Hospital Director of Nursing. Applications will be acknowledged by email. If you do not receive confirmation of receipt within 1 day of submitting your application online, please contact the named Recruitment Partner on the job specification immediately and prior to the closing date/time.

Given the degree of co-ordination and planning to have a Selection Committee available on the specified date, the University regrets that it may not be in a position to offer alternate selection dates. Where candidates are unavailable, reserves may be drawn from a shortlist. Outcomes of interviews are notified in writing to candidates and are issued no later than 5 working days following the selection day.

In some instances the Selection Committee may avail of telephone or video conferencing. The University's selection methods may consist of any or all of the following: Interviews, Presentations, Psychometric Testing, References and Situational Exercises.

It is the policy of the University to conduct pre-employment medical screening/full pre-employment medicals. Information supplied by candidates in their application (Cover Letter and CV) will be used to shortlist for interview.
