University Information	ACCOMODATION
	Crous - student accommodation, cheap but rooms can be very small and sometimes dirty
	Studapart - private accomodation, great because it gives you a list of all the things you can find in the apartment/house, but you have to pay a fee to the website
	LOCATION
	City centre can be crowded, so consider it if you want to live there
	South area near Bagatelle, Reynerie etc (where Université Jean Jaurès is) can be dangerous, especially at night time, I wouldn't recommend living there. The university is safe, but some areas around it are not
Academic Advice	Every module is worth a different amount of ECTS, so just be careful you're taking enough modules.
	French classes for erasmus students are worth a lot of credits so if your Erasmus coordinator is okay with you taking them it's great, they have literature classes, culture ones
	Lectures usually last 2 hours each, so it's a bit different from Trinity and you have to get used to it. Try not to take too many classes that are worth only 3 credits because then you'll have a lot of classes and more exams.
	I would consider taking some classes from the English department, especially if your french level is not that good, because some of their classes are thought through English, and students know English pretty well so you can make friends easier, if you think that the language can be a barrier.
